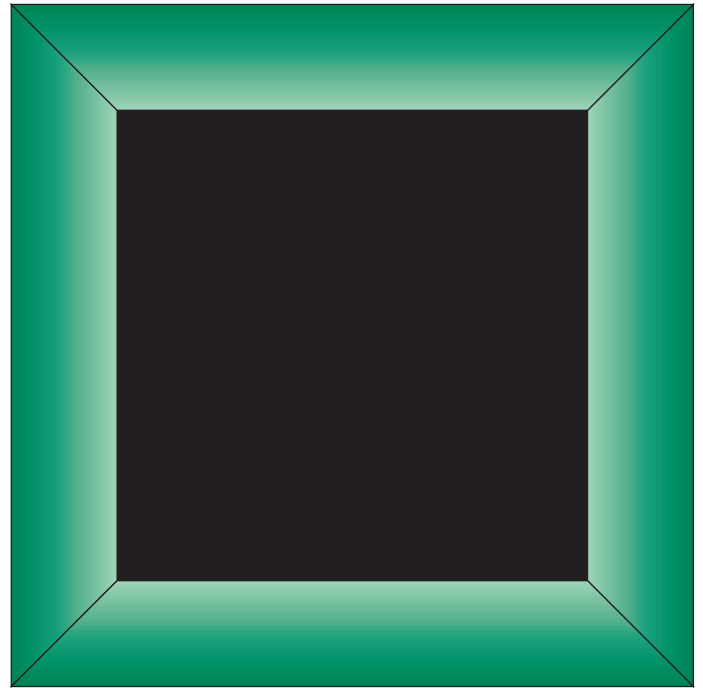


Eclectic REVERSIBLE TABLECLOTH

Finished size 50" x 50"

This reversible tablecloth uses an over all print in the center which is surrounded with a border stripe on all four sides, with mitered corners. Directions are given for making the napkins which are 20" x 20".



Eclectic Tablecloth – Materials Needed and Cutting Instructions (all measurements based on accurate cutting, 1/4" seam allowance, and 42" wide strips)

1 yard each for for center front and back	Cut 1 - 40 1/2" x 40 1/2" square for the front and 1 - 40 1/2" x 40 1/2" square for the back.
1 2/3 yard for border	Cut 4 - 9 1/2" x 59 1/2" lengthwise strips.
1 1/8 yard for four napkins	Cut 4 - 21" x 21" squares.

Passionata Tablecloth Sewing Instructions

1. To add the lengthwise stripe strips, mitering the corners, mark the center of each side with a pin. You need to have at least 7 1/2" fabric overhang on both ends of each strip to allow for mitering the corners. Figure 4.

Fold the four lengthwise border strips in half and place a pin at the center mark. Line up the centers and sew the strips to the center unit, starting and stopping 1/4" from the raw edges.

2. To form the mitered corner, lay the tablecloth on the ironing board. On the corner fold under the top fabric as shown at a forty-five degree angle. Figure 2. Press. Lift up the top edge and pin the two border fabric together. Turn to the wrong side and stitch on the fold line from the inside of the corner out. Trim the seam allowance to 1/4". Repeat for all four sides. Repeat for the back.

3. Place the right side of the backing on the right side of the tablecloth. Sew around the edges leaving an opening to turn the tablecloth to the right side. Turn right side out and press the edges. Sew the opening shut.

4. Topstitch 1/4" in from the finished edge and on the edge where the border and the center section meet. This will secure the backing to the tablecloth.

5. To make the napkins, turn under all four edges 1/4" twice and hem.

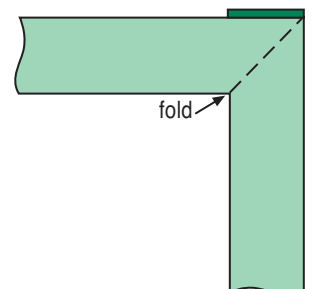
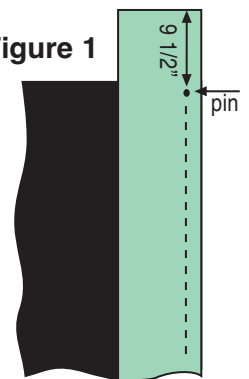
